#### Conflicts: Traditional Rules

- Current Client: duties of undivided loyalty and confidentiality.
- Former Client: duty of confidentiality  $\rightarrow$  prophylactic.
- Hot Potato Rule.

### Solution

Why don't conflicts in class actions routinely result in disqualification?

Courts adapt the rules to the class context.

## Conflicts Rules: Adapted to Class Context

- Courts say: **balancing**.
- Courts do:
- Duty of confidentiality, not undivided loyalty.
- Not prophylactic: **actual harm**  $\rightarrow$  confidential info adverse to client.
- No Hot Potato Rule.
