[PRO-STATUS QUO] Large companies in the U.S. compete and have created millions of domestic jobs, and they provide better and less expensive goods and services than anywhere else in the world. Having the government break up or punish these companies would be fundamentally anti-American and lead to worse outcomes for workers and consumers. Many of these companies were built from the ground up by hard-working entrepreneurs who sacrificed to find success. Increased government enforcement of antitrust laws would lead large companies to downsize or send jobs overseas, decrease choices for consumers, and charge higher prices. [93 WORDS]

[ANTI-MONOPOLY] The U.S. created the world's strongest economy by encouraging free markets where businesses compete to win customers by offering the highest quality and the best prices. But large, powerful corporations now dominate major parts of our economy. Because these wealthy corporations face no real competition, they can use their monopoly power to hoard profits, drive out competitors, crush small businesses, and give their CEO's millions in bonuses, all while workers' wages stagnate and consumers get price-gouged. Strengthening enforcement of our antitrust and anti-monopoly laws would strengthen our economy and the economic wellbeing of our families. [95 WORDS]
